I also collaborated in creating and teaching our school's first Eco-Tourism course in the '90's. Outside the field of Recreation and Tourism, I currently teach our Aiken Scholars Seminar, focused on environmental sustainability.

My long-term experience as a professional business owner in Vermont's travel and recreation industry has enabled me to bring the "real world" into the classroom, helping students understand the relationship between their education and recreation and tourism as functioning businesses in a constantly evolving environment. My professional work in recent years and my teaching at UVM reflect a strong emphasis on "Green and Sustainable" recreation and tourism.

Burlington, VT Vermont Tourism Network was created as an entrepreneurial business focused on cooperative marketing in the travel and tourism industry. VTN was sold in the summer of 2009 and continues to operate successfully. VTN represented over 150 clients in Vermont providing tourism marketing services which produced business. Ownership and twenty-five years of operating VTN enabled me to develop a tremendously broad spectrum of business, marketing and interpersonal skills and experiences, as well as professional relationships throughout Vermont and national and international business communities. All of this contributes to my classroom and advising work at UVM.

1981-1990: State of Vermont, General Assembly – House of Representatives, Montpelier, VT I was first elected to the Vermont House in 1980 and was re-elected four times. During my tenure I chaired the House Transportation Committee and served on the Government Operations Committee. I was co-founder and chair of a Legislative Tourism Caucus and served on the Administrative Rules Committee. During my tenure in the General Assembly I was recognized as a leader in initiating and supporting legislation favorable to Vermont's business community, especially in the areas of tourism and sports/recreation. I was also a dependable spokesperson for the University of Vermont – its budget and programs. The legislative experience gave me a lifelong in-depth understanding of Vermont's political system and, to a lesser extent, the politics and functioning of our federal government.
