COMMANDER'S UPDATE



Dear Green Mountain Battalion Alumni,

As the GMB wraps up another academic year and moves into the fall of 2024, I'd like to take a moment to inform all of you of the highlights, challenges, and changes our program had experienced last year and discuss a few initiatives going into the future. I hope all of you are doing well, and I appreciate the continued support to our magnificent program.

Last year was one of the most successful for the Green Mountain Battalion since my arrival three years ago. In October 2023, our program came in third place for the prestigious MacArthur Award, which is awarded to the best of the 42 programs in the Northeastern region of the United States. The criterion for winning this award is based on Cadet achievement in academics, Cadet Summer Training, extracurricular activities, demonstrated level of responsibility, and much more. Although we came in third place, the cadets clearly proved that they are among the best in the country. Our Ranger Challenge team also showed how well our Cadets stack up to their peers by earning an invitation to the Sandhurst Military Skills Competition for the first time in our program's history. Competing against the best teams in the world, our Ranger Challenge team placed 38th out of 50+ teams from the U.S., Europe, Asia, and South America. I was amazed at the level of perseverance and grit that our team displayed over the 4-day event at West Point, NY, in April 2024.

As all of you are aware, one of the most consistent aspects of military service is change. The cadre and staff at the GMB is not immune to this. That said, I'd like to provide an update on the personnel changes that've taken place in the last few semesters. Last year, we welcomed MAJ Anthony Thompson, the new Executive Officer; MAJ John Lescure, Vermont National Guard Liaison; LTC (R) Roger Drury, our new Human Resource Assistant; Mr. Joshua Lake, our new Logistics Technician; and Dr. Sarah Griffin, our new contracted instructor (and our alumni president). The addition of these talented individuals will help ensure continued success of our wonderful Cadets.

Before I close, I'd like to give an update on the actions we've taken in the wake of the tragic passing of Cadet Madison Saltsburg. I had the honor of escorting Madie's parents, Michelle and Toby, to the UVM commencement ceremony and the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences where Madie's parents received her posthumous degree. I can't thank the university enough for honoring one of the best Cadets this program has ever had. In addition, Madie's memorial fund has done very well. In accordance with Madie's parents' wishes, we've been able to donate a substantial amount of money to the Climbing Resource Access Group (CRAG) VT, a place Madie loved, where a climbing route has been named after her. The proceeds from the fund will also be used to finance an award in Madie's honor that we will add to the annual awards ceremony beginning in the spring of 2025. Lastly, we are working to get Madie a posthumous commission. More to follow on this effort.

Thank you all for your continued support to our talented Cadets.

BG Albrycht is the Commandant, United States Army, Military Police School; and Chief, United States Army Military Police Regiment. She is a native Vermonter hailing from Bennington, and was a Distinguished Military Graduate from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. BG Albrycht shared three lessons she learned throughout her career: 1.) Care about your Soldiers. 2.) Don't try to go it alone, and 3.) Do what's right, no matter the situation. ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

In 2023, UVM Alumni MAJ David Johnston '08, CPT Kyle Elliott '17, and CPT Samantha Lucas '16 deployed together to Iraq for nine months returning earlier this year. MAJ Johnston and CPT Elliott are members of the Vermont National Guard where they fly HH-60 MEDEVAC helicopters while CPT Lucas is in the Maryland National Guard and flies CH-47 Chinook Heavy Lift helicopters. Each Soldier shared some information and memories below from the deployment.

MAJ Johnston

Scope of job: Served as the MEDEVAC Commander overseeing 107 MEDEVAC Soldiers at six different locations throughout Syria, Iraq, Jordan, and Kuwait.

Favorite mission: All MEDEVAC missions are important; however, the most rewarding missions were flying Soldiers who were injured during one-way UAS attacks on forward outposts.

Favorite memory: The fondest long duration 'memory' I have of deployment, is the strong bond that I built with all the Soldiers I deployed with.

Funny story: The funniest thing that happened on deployment was when the firefighting foam system went off in the 80-yearold Fort Sill hangar and buried multiple aircraft in feet of white foam, events like that require you to have a good sense of humor. Bonus: GMB ROTC helped me learn how to effectively work with people from all different backgrounds and viewpoints. I was ahead of my 2LT peer group moving onto active duty because my UVM experience prepared me to effectively work with everyone, not just individuals who thought exactly the way I did.

CPT Lucas

Scope of job: I served as the Chinook Company Commander overseeing 65 Soldiers across three locations.

Favorite mission: My favorite mission was getting to work with partners beyond conventional Army units. One mission that stands out was getting to participate in a repatriation mission of a child. This mission had one of the biggest impacts and was not one I was anticipating getting to participate in.

Favorite memory: While it would have been nice to not have to go in to bunkers as frequently as we did, a favorite memory was doing sing-a-longs in the bunkers at Al Asad with my Soldiers. It kept folks' minds off of what was going on and made for a lot of laughs. Feel free to check out the Spotify Playlist "BUNKER BEATZ".

Funny story: My first interaction with MAJ Johnston for this mobilization was immediately following a command and staff sync the first night we arrived at Fort Cavasos for our mobilization training. Being in the National Guard, I had a digicam flight vest from my unit and they no longer field it with the new issue. Upon seeing me in mix matched camo, MAJ Johnston looked me right in

the eye and said, "You look like a Trash Panda". The name stuck for much of the deployment, and we had a good time laughing about it around our Active Duty counterparts who didn't think it was as funny.

Bonus: The Army is a small place and while often times it separates you from good friends, sometimes it brings you back together and you get to make awesome connections. Having a crew of GMB folks on the deployment was a lot of fun!

CPT Elliott

Scope of job: Served as a Platoon Leader and the Unit Movement Officer for a MEDEVAC Company stationed at Al Asad, Irag, and Camp Buehring, Kuwait.

Favorite mission: Oversaw 42 MEDEVAC missions carrying 34 patients and hundreds of pounds of medical supplies.

Favorite memory: Aside from helping those on their worst days, training with NATO partners was a top highlight.
