Subject: Vermont 4-H Embryology Program

NOTE: Please read all the information below as there are important Embryology

Program changes in 2025.

NOW is the time to start planning for the 2025 University of Vermont 4-H Embryology program as an enhancement to your classroom curriculum.

The Embryology program has become a popular spring lesson in schools and home-school programs across Vermont. We have secured a new supplier for fertile eggs and this year's supply is limited. However, if you get your registration to us early, we should have no problem in filling your request.

Embryology studies the developmental process of the chicken embryo while still in the egg. Students can examine the formation of the bird, starting from a tiny heartbeat to a feathered and fully developed chick. This hands-on activity is an exciting adventure which students remember years down the road.

For purchase, we offer a pre-set circulated air incubator. We have used this type of incubator for many years and have been very satisfied with its quality and the resulting hatch rates. The incubator is designed to hold a more uniform temperature by circulating the air through with a small fan and the temperature is preset for bird eggs. It has a large window for making observations. The circulated air incubator regulates itself, but still must be in a room with a stable temperature. It should not be used in sheds or barns. We also offer an auto-turner that fits the incubator.

We have had to change suppliers for our fertile eggs and have already placed our order, so for that reason our supply is limited. This year we are offering fertile eggs from **MEAT CHICKENS**. Quantities of fertile eggs are limited. Order early – orders will be filled as received. First come first served. As in previous years, you may return the chicks on the designated date.

IMPORTANT 2025 PROGRAM DATES

- Incubator orders must be received by **Friday, March 21, 2025**.
- Orders for fertile eggs and other supplies must be received by Tuesday, April 1. (If we sell out of eggs
 you will be notified immediately.)
- On Thursday, April 10 at 4:00 p.m. we will be hosting a workshop for new and returning participants.
 This is a great opportunity to ask questions and hear tips from other educators. The workshop is free,
 but you must pre-register by Tuesday, April 1. Workshop location is 140 Kennedy Drive, Suite 201,
 South Burlington. All participants especially first-time participants are highly encouraged to
 attend.

2025 4-H EMBRYOLOGY PROJECT - DATES TO REMEMBER

Tuesday, April 29 – Egg Pick-up locations and times:

Morrisville: 1 p.m. - 3 p.m.

Final Preparations

- Have your incubator plugged in and ready to set the eggs on Tuesday, April 29th.
- Bring eggs to room temperature before placing in incubator, Tuesday morning, April 29th
- If using an egg turner, the pointed end goes down.
- Tuesday, April 29 is "Day Zero" and Wednesday, April 30 is "Day One."

Friday, May 16

Last day to turn eggs!

- Remove eggs from turner or stop turning if hand turning.
- Place eggs on layer of cheesecloth.
- Increase humidity in incubator.

Tuesday, May 20

Hatch Day!!!!

- Have brooding area ready ahead of time. Be sure heat source is properly secured. Use a heat plate rather than a heat lamp if possible.
- Keep chicks in incubator until fully dry. This may mean leaving them in the incubator overnight.

Friday, May 23 - Chick Return: ONE DAY ONLY

- This is the only day to return chicks; drop off is at the South Burlington and St. Albans Extension offices.
- If you are not able to return chicks on this date call Martha Manning at 802-782-5056 prior to Wednesday, May 20 to make other arrangements.
- DO NOT PUT CHICKS on Craigslist, Front Porch Forum, or other sites to rehome.

Important Notes

- Egg Set: All eggs should be set on Tuesday, April 29. Remember this counts as Day zero Day 1 is twenty-four hours later (April 30)
- **Turning:** Eggs must be turned on the first and second weekends (May 3 / 4 AND May 10 / 11) to ensure proper development. An automatic turner is another option. Eggs must be removed from the automatic egg turner on May16th.
- Monitor humidity/water level through the incubation period. Incorrect humidity is the primary cause of poor hatches!
